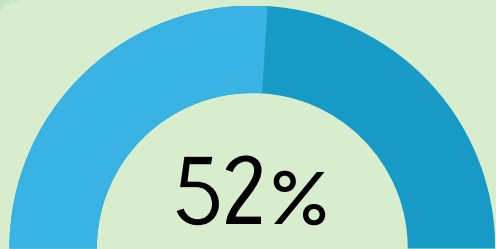

# CLTS

## Children's Long-Term Support

is a program that helps children with disabilities and their families through supports and services that help children grow and live their best lives. It is a home and community-based service waiver. It uses a Medicaid waiver to fund services for kids with disabilities. We serve children with physical disabilities, developmental disabilities and mental health diagnoses.

### Common Services Provided

Service Coordination • Adaptive Aids  
Personal Emergency Response System  
Respite Care • Home Modifications  
Independent Skills Training

# CCS

## Comprehensive Community Services

is a program that helps people of all ages live their best lives. It focuses on unique needs that relate to mental health and substance use. Those enrolled in CCS take control of their treatment and recovery. They work with a team to decide which services and supports will help them reach their goals.

### Common Services Provided

- Diagnostic tests
- Screening and assessment
- Psychotherapy
- Substance use treatment
- Peer support
- Medication management assistance
- Skill growth and refinement
- Wellness management and recovery

### Eligibility for CCS:

All ages

Annual functional screen process

Be Medicaid eligible

Diagnosed with: Substance Use Disorder and/or Mental Health Disorder
